### DIGITAL MAPPING OF ANCIENT SITES

### 456. DR. T. SUMATHY (a) THAMIZHACHI THANGAPANDIAN:

Will the Minister of CULTURE be pleased to state:-

- (a) whether the Archaeological Survey of India has made any recent archaeological exploration or expedition to identify and record ancient Tamil Brahmi and early-historic and medieval inscriptions, prehistoric rock paintings, rock engravings in the country;
- (b) if so, the details thereof and the important findings made during the last nine years, Circle-wise particularly from Tamil Nadu;
- (c) the steps taken by the Government for the digital mapping of ancient sites having ancient Tamil Brahmi inscriptions, Archaic rock paintings and rock engravings and the funds allocated to the same;
- (d) the measures taken by the Government to excavate the archaic sites in Tamil Nadu to bring to light the archaeological evidences corresponding to the Ancient Tamil Sangam flourished 2000 years ago; and
- (e) the effective steps taken by the Government to catalogue and publish the early historical inscriptions, Numismatics and other important archaeological discoveries made in Tamil Nadu?

#### **ANSWER**

## THE MINISTER OF CULTURE, TOURISM AND DEVELOPMENT OF NORTH EASTERN REGION

### (SHRI G. KISHAN REDDY)

- (a) The Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) has undertaken village to village survey and exploration across the country to search and document the archaeological remains, which includes temples, mosques, rock cut caves, stupas, inscriptions, megaliths, sculptures, etc.
- (b) The details are at Annexure-I.
- (c) ASI in technical collaboration with Bhaskaracharya Institute for Space Applications and Geoinformatics (BISAG) has launched a mobile application 'Indian Heritage' in September, 2023 containing information on protected monuments and protected areas with textual content and aided by interactive digital maps. The phase that has been launched incorporates 143 ticketed monuments with the ASI.
- (d) During last three years, the ASI has conducted excavations in the state of Tamil Nadu and Central Government has granted approval to the State Department of Archaeology, Universities and Research Institutions for conducting excavations in Tamil Nadu. The details are at Annexure-II.
- (e) The ASI publishes the early historical inscriptions, Numismatics and other important archaeological discoveries yearly in departmental publications namely (i) *Indian Archaeology* A Review, (ii) Annual Report on Indian Epigraphy, and South Indian Inscriptions Volume.
