Will the Minister of AYUSH be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of Ayurswasthya Yojana highlighting its major components;
- (b) whether any notable milestones have been achieved under the scheme and if so, the details thereof;
- (c) the details of the funds allocated and utilized under Ayurswasthya Yojana during the year 2022-23, State/UT-wise including Pali Parliamentary Constituency in Rajasthan;
- (d) whether any project/proposal has been approved and funded in Pali Parliamentary Constituency for AYUSH intervention on Public Health and if so, the details thereof;
- (e) whether any mobile clinic has been approved for AYUSH intervention in remote and tribal area of Rajasthan including Pali Parliamentary Constituency and if so, the details thereof; and
- (f) whether the Government plans to promote AYUSH interventions in sports medicine and launch any funding scheme for the same, if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefor?

ANSWER

(a) Central Sector Scheme of AYURSWASTHYA Yojana has two components i.e. (i) AYUSH and Public Health (ii) Centre of Excellence (CoE). The AYURSWASTHYA Yojana was implemented since financial year 2021-22. The detailed guidelines of the scheme is available in the public domain at <https://main.avush.gov.in/schemes-2/central-sector-scheme/ayurswasthya-yojana/>

(b) The notable achievement since its inception is annexed at **Annexure-I**.

(c) Under the AYURSWASTHYA Yojana, funds are provided to the eligible organizations across the country (including the organization situated in the State of Rajasthan). The details of project approved and funded to the organizations under Ayurswasthya Yojana during the year 2022-23 State/UT-wise are placed at **Annexure-II**.

(d) No fund was released to any organization located in Pali Parliamentary Constituency of Rajasthan under Ayush and Public Health component of Ayurswasthya Yojana.

(e) Under Ayurswasthya Yojana, financial assistance is supported for various activities including mobile clinic. However, till date no such activities were supported under this scheme. Moreover, some of the Research Councils under this Ministry are running mobile health care program, across the country including the State of Rajasthan, which is placed at **Annexure-III**.

(f) Under the Ayush & Public Health component of the Scheme, there is provision for funding, upto Rs.1.00 crore to the eligible organizations, for Ayush intervention in sports medicine with the aim to promote use of AYUSH Interventions in sports medicine for promoting health and fitness of sports persons and to promote AYUSH therapeutic interventions for treatment of sports related injuries and their re-habilitation.
