UTILISATION OF NIRBHAYA FUND IN JHARKHAND

93 (H). SHRI SANJAY SETH:

Will the Minister of Women and Child Development be pleased to state:

- (a) the major features and objectives of establishment of Nirbhaya Fund;
- (b) the amount allocated under the Nirbhaya Fund since its establishment, Statewise and year-wise;
- (c) the number of proposals received by the Union Government from the State Government of Jharkhand for utilisation of the said fund; and
- (d) the initiatives taken under the Nirbhaya Fund in Jharkhand along with the details and number of beneficiaries thereof?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF WOMEN AND CHILD DEVELOPMENT (SHRIMATI SMRITI ZUBIN IRANI)

- (a): The Nirbhaya Fund, a non-lapsable corpus, was established by the Government for providing funding to the Project/ Schemes specifically aimed at the Safety and Security of Women and girls. As per the Framework for Nirbhaya Fund, the proposed projects under the Nirbhaya Fund should have the following features:
 - i. Direct impact on safety and security concerns of women
 - ii. Optimum use of existing infrastructure
 - iii. Innovative use of technology
 - iv. No duplication of existing government schemes/ programmes
 - v. Provision for real time intervention as far as possible. e.g. in case of CCTVs for women's safety, there should be real-time monitoring of footage and quick response, rather than just a recording of events for evidence after the incident has occurred
 - vi. Strict privacy and confidentiality of women's identity and information. e.g. placement of CCTVs so as to not compromise women's privacy, protection of video data collected etc.
- vii. Defined role of all stakeholders

Further the Framework provides for clear definition of project as under:

- i. Inputs required manpower, physical assets, financial resources etc.
- ii. Activities to be undertaken during the project cycle e.g. trainings, building infrastructure etc.

- iii. Outputs product of the project e.g. number of people reached, area covered etc.
- iv. Measurable outcomes expected achievement of the project e.g. increase in prosecutions of crime against women, reduction in crime rate etc. e.g. installation of 500 CCTVs at crime prone areas and public places is a project output. However, this offers no indication of whether the technology is actually used or if it improves police effectiveness. The outcome of such a project could be a reduction in incidents of crime, increasing use of CCTV footage as evidence in court, more prosecutions for crime against women etc.
- v. No. of beneficiaries to be reached absolute or estimated.
- vi. Defined monitoring mechanism from lowest level up to Ministry of Women and Child Development.
- vii. Support of State Women and Child Development Department (WCD) /Social Welfare Department, State Home Department and concerned central Ministry/Department (in case of proposals from States.
- (b): Under the Nirbhaya Fund, upto the financial year 2023-24, a total amount of Rs 7212.85 Crore has been allocated. The total amount released by the Ministries/ Departments and utilized out of the Nirbhaya fund since inception is Rs 5448.0945 Crore which is nearly 75% of the total allocation. The scheme/ project wise details of amount released by the Ministries/ Departments and utilized out of the Nirbhaya fund is at **Annexure**.
- (c) & (d): The Projects/ Schemes under Nirbhaya Fund that have been implemented/being implemented in the State of Jharkhand include, Emergency Response Support System (ERSS)-112, Setting-up/ Strengthening Anti-Human Trafficking Units (AHTU), Setting-up/ Strengthening Women Help Desk (WHDs), Cyber Crime Prevention against Women & Children (CCPWC), Cyber forensic and related facilities in State Forensic Science Laboratories (SFSLs), Universalisation of Women Helpline (WHL)-181, State-wise Vehicle Tracking Platform (VTP), Training of Investigating Officers (IOs)/ Prosecution Officers (POs)/ Medical Officers (MOs) in Forensic Evidence collection, Setting up Fast Track Special Courts (FTSCs) to dispose of cases pending trial under rape and POCSO Act. According to the data from the High Court of Jharkhand, 22 FTSCs are operational in the state. There are 24 operational One Stop Centers (OSCs) in the State of Jharkhand with an OSC in each of the 24 districts and Lighting of Dark Spots in AMRUT Cities in respect of Arunachal Pradesh, Nagaland, Tripura and Jharkhand etc.

A total of 3435 women have been provided assistance by the One Stop Centers and 41587 women have been provided assistance by the WHL in the State of Jharkhand. The FTSCs in Jharkhand have disposed of over 5383 cases related to rape and cases under the POCSO Act.
