UPGRADATION OF HOSPITALS IN RURAL AREAS

2011. DR. MANOJ RAJORIA:

Will the Minister of **HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government proposes to upgrade facilities in hospitals/wellness centres in the country;
- (b) if so, the details thereof;
- (c) whether the Government has taken steps for modernisation of the hospitals especially the hospitals of rural areas of the country including Rajasthan; and
- (d) if so, the State-wise details thereof along with the funds allocated for the same including Rajasthan?

ANSWER THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (SHRI ASHWINI KUMAR CHOUBEY)

- (a) & (b): Under Ayushman Bharat Health & Wellness Centres (AB-HWCs), 1.5 lakh Health Sub Centres and Primary Health Centres are to be transformed into Health and Wellness Centres across the country for provision of comprehensive primary care that includes preventive healthcare and health promotion at the community level with continuum of care approach by December, 2022. The roll out plan of AB HWCs is given as below:
 - FY 2018-19 = 15,000
 - FY 2019-20 = 25,000 (Cumulative 40,000)
 - FY 2020-21 = 30,000 (Cumulative 70,000)
 - FY 2021-2022 = 40,000 (Cumulative 1,10,000)
 - Till 31st December 2022 = 40,000 (Cumulative 1,50,000)
- (c) & (d): "Public Health & Hospital" being a state subject, the primary responsibility of modernisation of Government hospitals all over the country including in rural areas is that of respective State Government. Under National Health Mission (NHM), the central government provides technical and financial support to States/UTs support for equipment, use of modern technologies & upgradation of infrastructure based on proposals received from respective States/UTs in their Programme Implementation Plan (PIPs). The state wise details of approvals for upgradation of Hospitals, New Construction including AB-HWCs under NHM for the FY 2017-18 to 2019-20 is at Annexure.
