Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the shortage of teachers in Kendriya Vidyalayas (KVs) has adversely affected students of class X to XII in both the shifts and if so, the total number of posts of teachers lying vacant in KVs in the country till date, State/UT-wise along with the measures taken/being taken by the Government to fill up the same;
- (b) whether the e-classrooms established by the KVs with a view to provide quality education is not working as teachers are not using it or most of them are not functional; and
- (c) if so, the details thereof and the reasons therefor along with the strict action taken to ensure the use of e-classrooms by teachers?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI RAMESH POKHRIYAL 'NISHANK')

- (a) Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS) has informed that as on 15.11.2019, there are 5949 teaching posts lying vacant against 48236 sanctioned posts in different Kendriya Vidyalayas (KVs) in the country. State/UT-wise details are annexed. Filling up of vacancies is a continuous process and action is taken from time to time as per the provisions of the relevant recruitment rules for filling up of the posts. Teachers are also engaged on contractual basis for temporary duration by Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan to ensure that the teaching-learning process is not hampered.
- (b) & (c) No, Sir. The e-classrooms established in Kendriya Vidyalayas with a view to provide quality education are being used by teachers. The e-content developed by the teachers and available from open resources is being used as per need of subject and topic to enrich the quality of teaching learning process.
