Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of the new Indian Institutes of Management (IIMs) proposed by the Government;
- (b) whether the new IIMs are facing shortage of faculty;
- (c) if so, the details thereof;
- (d) the details of the student-teacher ratio prescribed for IIMs;
- (e) whether complete information is not provided for admission in new IIMs after releasing the marks of joint entrance exam;
- (f) if so, the details thereof; and
- (g) the steps taken/being taken by the Government in this regard?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI RAMESH POKHRIYAL 'NISHANK')

- (a) to (c): There are seven new IIMs established at Amritsar, Bodh Gaya, Nagpur, Sirmaur, Sambalpur, Visakhapatnam & Jammu. At present, there is no more proposal to set up any new IIM. There are no shortage of faculty in the seven new IIMs.
- (d): In general, teacher student ratio in IIMs is 1:10. However, the ratio keeps on varying, inter alia, due to change in the number of students intake.
- (e) to (g): No Sir. Complete information related to admission process in new IIMs is provided on their respective websites.
