2446. SHRIMATI MAHUA MOITRA:

Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) the status on increasing the number of Integrated Check Posts between the State of West Bengal and Bangladesh along with the progress on each of those projects; and
- (b) the status of signing the agreement for free movement of trucks between India and Bangladesh to further effective and efficient trade between the countries?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI NITYANAND RAI)

- (a): Government of India has operationalized one Integrated Check Post (ICP) at Petrapole in West Bengal along Indo-Bangladesh Border on 12th February,2016. Subsequently, on 17th December, 2018, 'in principle' approval was accorded, *interalia* for acquisition of land and preparation of Detailed Engineering Report (DER) for development of ICPs at 05 (five) locations viz; (i) Ghojadanga, (ii) Changrabandha, (iii) Fulbari, (iv) Mahadipur and (v) Hili, along the Indo-Bangladesh Border in West Bengal. Government of West Bengal has constituted a team headed by Special Secretary, Department of Home & Hill Affairs, to assess the availability of land for these 5 ICPs.
- (b): The Motor Vehicle Agreement between Bhutan, Bangladesh, India and Nepal was signed in June 2015, for seamless movement of vehicles across borders.
