(a) the funds allocated to Tamil Nadu under the Swachh Bharat Abhiyan (Rural), construction of community toilets and toilets for individual household during each of the last five years;

(b) whether the Government has any plans to check, verify and audit the physical condition of toilets constructed under the said Abhiyan; and

(c) if so, the details thereof?

(a) Swachh Bharat Mission (Gramin) [SBM(G)] is a demand driven scheme, hence fixed State-wise allocation of funds is not made. However, details of funds released by the Government of India to Tamil Nadu under SBM(G) during each of the last five years are as under:

And, the number of Community Sanitary Complexes (CSCs) and individual household latrines (IHHLs) constructed under SBM(G) in Tamil Nadu during each of the last five

years, as per the data reported by the State on the online Integrated Management Information System (IMIS), are as under:

(b) and (c) Department of Drinking Water and Sanitation have conducted National Annual Rural Sanitation Survey (NARSS) through an independent agency in 2017-18 and 2018-19. Under these sample surveys, detailed information have been collected on access to toilets, usage of toilets, open defecation free (ODF) status of villages, etc. Advisory has also been issued to the States to conduct similar kind of survey at State level.
