**3333. SHRI D.K.SURESH:**

Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Central Institute of Indian Languages (CIIL) imparts training to non-native school teachers, prospective teachers and general public through ten month diploma course to teachers across the country in all southern languages;
- (b) if so, the details thereof;
- (c) the total number of people including teachers enrolled for the said diploma course of CIIL during the last five years, year/language-wise including Kannada, Tamil, Telugu and Malayalam; and
- (d) the details of the total fund allocated for promotion of Indian languages by the CIIL?

(a) to (c): Yes Sir. The Central Institute of Indian Languages (CIIL), Mysore imparts training to non native school teachers, prospective teachers through ten month diploma course to teachers in its Regional Language Centres located at Mysore, Lucknow, Patiala, Solan, Pune, Bhubaneswar, Guwahati. The details of language courses imparted at different centres are as follows:
