Objective Oriented Programs

†3390. SHRI RODMAL NAGAR:

Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether any scheme has been formulated to review the objective oriented programs conducted in the Universities which receives grants from the Government;
- (b) if so, the details thereof;
- (c) if not, the steps being taken by the Government to review the fulfilment of the objectives of the establishment of institutions like JNU; and
- (d) the action taken on the anti-national, aimless, improper and undesirable programs after the review of JNU along with the details thereof?

ANSWER

(a) & (b): The Universities are autonomous bodies established or incorporated by or under a Central Act, a Provincial Act or a State Act which lay down the purpose of their establishment along with institutional objectives. Therefore, it is the responsibility of the establishing State / Centre that Universities fulfill their purpose of establishment.

(c) & (d): All Central Universities, including Jawahar Lal Nehru University (JNU), are required to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the Administrative Ministry which clearly spell out performance parameters, output targets in terms of details of programme of work and qualitative improvement in output along with commensurate input requirements. Accordingly, Vice Chancellors of Central Universities including JNU under the Ministry have submitted MoUs comprising, inter-alia, performance parameters of current academic year and corresponding targets for the next academic year.
