- (d) whether the Government has any comparative data with regard to the rate of conviction of cases investigated by CBI and other State police; and
- (e) if so, the details thereof?

(a) & (b): No Sir. The number of cases [Regular cases (RCs) and Preliminary Enquiries (PEs)] registered by CBI during the last 3 three years i.e. 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019 (upto 31.10.2019) are as under:-
