## PROTOCOL OF DIGNITARIES

- (a) whether there is any clear definition for the protocol of dignitaries/VIPs travelling by domestic or international flights and if so, the details thereof; and
- (b) whether the airlines and the companies managing airports have been given specific instructions about the protocol of dignitaries/VIPs and if so, the list of such people?

## ANSWER

(a) & (b): Bureau of Civil Aviation Security (BCAS), an attached office of this Ministry and aviation security regulator in the country has issued Aviation Security (AVSEC) Circular No.18/2009 for extending courtesy to Hon'ble Members of Parliament at airports during their visits to airports. BCAS has also issued AVSEC Order No.06/2015 for exemption from Pre-embarkation Security Checks at civil airports to dignitaries and their accompanying spouse. The facilities provided to dignitaries/Members of Parliament at the airports are given as under:-Reserved Lounge facilities at international and domestic terminals of the airports.

- Tea/Coffee/Water served free of charge

- Member of Parliament acts as Chairman of Airport Advisory Committee in respect of the airports which falls under his/her constituency

- Free Access to the Hon'ble MP in the Terminal Building and Visitors gallery on

the basis of Identity Card

- Airport Entry Pass to personal staff of MP - one at New Delhi and another for an airport nearest to his/her constituency

- One officer at the airport is designated as Protocol officer at each airport and is responsible for extension of all facilities / courtesies to MPs.

The protocol is to be followed by all concerned, including domestic private airports and airlines.
