- (a) whether any study/survey has been conducted/proposed to be conducted to find out the population of various tribal communities living in forest areas of the country;
- (b) if so, the details thereof; and
- (c) the base/criteria adopted by the Government for introducing welfare measures for the tribal people?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE FOR TRIBAL AFFAIRS (SMT. RENUKA SINGH SARUTA)

(a) to (b): No such study/survey has been conducted during last five years to find out the population of various tribal people living in forest areas of the country. There is no proposal under consideration of the Ministry for conducting new study for the same.
