**SCHEMES FOR ENTREPRENEURS IN MSME SECTOR**

791. SHRI GOPAL CHINNAYA SHETTY:

Will the Minister of MICRO, SMALL AND MEDIUM ENTERPRISES be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of the schemes available to the Micro, Small & Medium Entrepreneurs of poor and middle class;
- (b) the total number of such entrepreneurs functioning in the country and the details and the number of entrepreneurs among them belonging to poor and middle classes;
- (c) the quantum of total business being undertaken by Micro, Small & Medium Entrepreneurs and their contribution in the Gross Domestic Product of the country; and
- (d) the quantum of total business being undertaken by Micro, Small & Medium Entrepreneurs belonging to poor and middle classes?

**ANSWER**

MINISTER FOR MICRO, SMALL AND MEDIUM ENTERPRISES

- (a): Ministry of MSME implements following schemes for development of MSMEs:
- I. Prime Minister's Employment Generation Programme (PMEGP) to generate self employment opportunities through establishment of Micro Enterprises in the non farm sector.
  - II. Micro & Small Enterprises -Cluster Development Programme (MSE-CDP).
  - III. Interventions for Aspirational Communities and Areas: SC-ST Hub, Scheme for Promotion of MSMEs in N.E. Region and Sikkim etc.
  - IV. Tool Rooms and Technology Centres (TCs) to support MSMEs by providing skilled manpower, access to advanced technology and business advisory services.
  - V. Mission Solar Charkha (MSC) to increase employment avenues in the rural hinterland through eco-friendly and technology-led growth.
  - VI. Scheme of Fund for Regeneration of Traditional Industries to provide support to the artisans.
  - VII. Procurement and Marketing Support Scheme to enhance the marketability of products and services in the MSME sector. Every Central Ministry/Department/PSU to compulsorily procure 25 percent from MSEs. Out of the 25% procurement mandated from MSEs, 3% has been reserved for women entrepreneurs.
  - VIII. Entrepreneurship Skill Development Programme (ESDP) to upgrade skills of prospective entrepreneurs, existing workforce and also develop skills of new workers and technicians of MSEs.
  - IX. Credit Guarantee Scheme to support collateral free loan to MSEs.
  - X. Interest subvention of 2% for all GST registered MSMEs on fresh or incremental loans.
  - XI. National Manufacturing Competitiveness Programme to support the competitiveness of the Manufacturing Sector.

(b) to (d): As on 15.11.2019, the total number of micro, small & medium enterprises in the country registered on Udyog Aadhar Portal are 70.61 Lakhs, 8.70 Lakhs & 0.34 Lakhs respectively. As reported by Central Statistics Office (CSO), the share of MSMEs in total Gross Domestic Product (GDP) during the year 2017-18 was 29.7%.

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
