*303. SHRIMATI RAKSHA NIKHIL KHADSE:

Will be Minister of Culture be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government proposes to strengthen and convert some monument sites such as Shaniwar Wada in Pune, Muktabai temple in Muktainagar, Jalgaon District of Maharashtra and likewise monuments across the country having historical importance and preserved as heritage structure which are getting deteriorated over the period and are presently under the control/custody of Archaeology Department since long as earning centres by using some modern techniques for their beautification such as museum, light and sound shows and Laser-show for attracting tourists;
- (b) if so, the details thereof; and
- (c) the proposed development projects to be undertaken in phase-wise manner in this regard?

STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO PART (a) TO (c) OF THE LOK SABHA STARRED QUESTION NO.303 FOR 16.3.2020

(a)to(c) There is no such proposal to convert any centrally protected monument as earning centre. However, regular conservation, preservation and annual maintenance are taken up beside environmental upgradation and providing facilities like drinking water, toilet, benches, ramps, wheel chairs, signages (including Braille), illumination, sound & light shows, cafeteria, publication sale counter, etc. Further, at potential monuments, museums have been developed. Sound and Light show is functioning at Shaniwar Wada, Pune. The Muktabai Temple at Muktawadi is not a centrally protected monument. Archaeological Survey of India undertakes special conservation and preservation of about 600-700 monuments every year based on priority, site requirement and budget allocation besides annual maintenance and minor repairs to all protected monument. Shaniwar Wada at Pune is in a fair state of conservation. Expenditure incurred on conservation, preservation and annual maintenance of all centrally protected monuments all over the country is as under:

Since there is no proposal to convert any monument as earning centre, question of intended development does not arise. However, providing tourist facilities and up-grading them from time to time is a continuous phenomenon.
