**STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO PARTS (a) TO (d) OF THE LOK SABHA STARRED QUESTION No. 61 FOR 06/02/2020 ASKED BY SH. RAHUL KASWAN REGARDING DAY BOARDING CENTRES.**

**The Sports Authority of India (SAI) does not set up Day Boarding Centres. SAI runs Regional Training Centres, SAI Training Centres and National Institute of Sports (NIS), Patiala. These SAI training facilities are available to residential as well as non-residential athletes selected under various sports promotion schemes of the Department of Sports and SAI. In the State of Rajasthan, SAI is running its training centres at Jodhpur, Alwar and Jaipur. In these 3 SAI Training Centres, a total of 231 athletes are benefitting which includes 104 day boarders.**

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
