#### **Teaching through Mother Tongue**

### 1162. SHRI S. VENKATESAN: SHRI JAYADEV GALLA:

Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that many surveys/studies conducted in the country indicate that children in the first few years of their schooling could understand well if they are taught in their own mother tongue and if so, the details thereof;

(b) whether there are many States in the country which are teaching only in English medium upto primary level and if so, the details thereof;

(c) whether the Government feels that imparting education only in English upto primary level is likely to hamper the natural learning process of children below the age of 9-10 years and if so, the details thereof;

(d) the details of recognized schools using mother tongue as medium of instruction in the primary, upper primary, secondary and higher secondary stage, State-wise;

(e) the details of recognized schools using Hindi and/or English as medium of instruction in the primary, upper primary, secondary and higher secondary stage, Statewise;

(f) the number of recognized schools using Tamil and/or English as medium of instruction in the primary, upper primary, secondary and higher secondary stage, Statewise; and

(g) the steps taken/to be taken by the Government using mother tongue as medium of instruction from primary to higher secondary level?

## ANSWER MINISTER OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI RAMESH POKHRIYAL 'NISHANK')

(a)to (c) Para 3.1.1 of the National Curriculum Framework (NCF) 2005 states that home language(s) of children, as defined in para 3.1 should be medium of learning in schools. Para 3.1 of NCF, 2005 defines home language or mother tongue as languages

subsuming the languages of home, larger kinship groups, street and neighbourhood that a child acquires naturally from his/her home and societal /environment. If a school does not have provisions for teaching in the child's home language(s) at the higher levels, primary schools education must still be covered through the home language(s). There is no State/Union Territory teaching only in English at primary level in the country.

(d) A statement indicating State-wise number of primary schools using mother tongue as medium of instruction is placed at **Annexure-I.** No data about secondary and higher secondary stage using mother tongue as a medium of instruction is captured and maintained centrally.

(e) & (f) A statement containing the requisite information is placed at **Annexure-II.** 

(g) Section 29 (2) of the Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education (RTE) Act, 2009,*inter-alia*, provides that the medium of instruction shall, as far as practicable, be in child's mother tongue. However, as education is a subject in the Concurrent List of the Constitution and majority of schools are under the purview of the State Governments, it is for the respective State Governments to take appropriate action in this regard in their schools.
