Contractual Teachers in Government Schools and Kendriya Vidyalayas

Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) the number of ad-hoc/contractual teachers employed in Government schools and Kendriya Vidyalayas during each of the last three years, State/UT-wise;
- (b) whether the Government has adopted any criteria for appointment of these adhoc/contractual teachers and if so, the details thereof;
- (c) whether these teachers who are not highly experienced are deployed to teach in higher classes affecting career of students and if so, the corrective steps taken by the Government in this regard;
- (d) whether the Government is aware that thousands of teachers working on ad-hoc/contract basis in the country are reportedly not getting even minimum wages and if so, the details thereof and the reaction of the Government thereto;
- (e) whether the Government plans to extend basic facility and social security to these ad-hoc teachers and if so, the details thereof; and
- (f) the measures taken/proposed to be taken by the Government to streamline the system and ensure that at least minimum wages are paid to all contractual and ad-hoc teachers across the country?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI RAMESH POKHRIYAL 'NISHANK')

(a) to (f): The number of adhoc/contractual teachers in Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS) employed during the last three years is at Annexure. Part time teachers in KVS are engaged as per the eligibility criteria laid down by the KVS against existing/leave vacancy and on day to day basis. The remuneration of part time teachers is regulated according to the recommendation of the Finance Committee duly approved by Board of Governors in its 94th meeting held in December 2012.

Further, education is in the concurrent list of the Constitution and majority of the schools come under the jurisdiction of the respective States and Union Territory (UT) Government which is the appropriate Government under the Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education (RTE) Act, 2009. The recruitment, service conditions and deployment of teachers and other staff come under the purview of the concerned State/UT Government. Ministry of Human Resource Development has been requesting all the States and UT Governments for filling-up the vacant posts of teachers and their rational deployment, for which the Ministry has been issuing advisories to all the States and UTs from time to time. Further, the Central Government, through the Centrally Sponsored Scheme of Samagra Shiksha, provides assistance to the States and UTs for deployment of additional teachers to maintain appropriate Pupil Teacher Ratio as per the prescribed norms for various levels of schooling.
