Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of the digital education programmes and schemes being run to impart employment oriented and quality education to students and to provide training to the teachers along with their teaching work in the remote areas and rural areas of the country, State-wise including Maharashtra;
- (b) the funds allocated and spent on digital education specially in the rural areas during the last three years and the details thereof, State-wise; and
- (c) if so, the digital schemes related to health and the main objectives thereof along with the details thereof, State-wise?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI RAMESH POKHRIYAL 'NISHANK')

- (a) The key initiatives for the Ministry of Human Resource Development on Digital Education programmes include:
 - SWAYAM: the online education platform covering all disciplines in higher and school education.
 - SWAYAM Prabha: 32 DTH TV high quality educational channels for higher and school education.
 - The Free and Open Source Software for Education (FOSSEE): to promote the use of open source software in higher education.
 - **ARPIT:** An online Annual Refresher Programme in Teaching (ARPIT) for the in-service teachers in the higher education.
 - Further to facilitate digital education in rural areas, full-fledged degree/diploma level online education have started from January, 2020 by IGNOU(Indira Gandhi National Open University) and Amity University.
 - **DIKSHA:** The DIKSHA (Digital Infrastructure for Knowledge Sharing) platform offers teachers, students and parents, engaging learning material relevant to the prescribed school curriculum.
 - **Talking books for Visually Impaired Learners was** developed in DAISY (Digital Accessible Information System) format for Senior Secondary and Secondary Course. DAISY is designed to be a complete audio substitute for print material and is specifically designed for use by people with "print disabilities," including blindness, impaired vision, and dyslexia.

- **Mukta Vidya Vani:** Web Audio Streaming Live Personal Contact Programmes of 3 hours broadcast every day from NIOS Audio Studio, then repeat 2 times and archived.
- **Open Educational Resources (OER):** OERs available specifically for Vocational programmes to be offered at Secondary (10th) and Sr. Secondary (+2) levels, including standalone programmes, in partnership with state level institutions and organizations.
- e-Pathshala : A web portal (<u>http://epathshala.nic.in/, http://epathshala.gov.in/</u>) and National Repository of Open Educational Resources (NROER): NROER portal (<u>http://nroer.gov.in/welcome</u>) were developed for teachers and teacher-educators.
- National Initiative for School Heads and Teachers Holistic Advancement (NISHTHA): A web portal and mobile app for management of NISHTHA training has been developed. The training for Heads & Teachers has been completed for 8 states and is in progress for 18 States.
- (b) All the above schemes of Higher Education & School Education are applicable pan India including Maharashtra. The funds allocated and spent in the last 3 years are as follows:

(c) National Medical College Network (NMCN) scheme was created with an aim of creating a homogenous environment within shortlisted 50 Medical Colleges interconnected on National Knowledge Network (NKN) to provide Tele-Education, Tele-Mentoring, Tele-Medicine and eLearning facilities to the Students, Doctors and Citizens. The Central Sponsored Scheme (CSS) got approved with the estimated budget of Rs. 104 Crores through EFC in Feb 2014 with implementation and Operational timelines of 5 years (where NMCN is also one of the components). Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (MoHFW) in consultation with State Governments has identified a National Resource Centre (NRC) at Sanjay Gandhi Postgraduate Institute of Medical Sciences (SGPGI)- Lucknow for providing necessary handholding and technical support for implementation and 7 Regional Resource Centers (RRCs) in different zones to take up the task of NMCN implementation. The NMCN scheme is operational in 49 Colleges.
