ACCESSIBILITY OF HERITAGE SITES TO DIFFERENTLY-ABLED PERSONS

1727. SHRI CHANDRA SEKHAR BELLANA:

Will the **Minister of CULTURE** be pleased to state:

- a) whether the country has 38 UNESCO World Heritage Sites from which 30 are cultural sites, 7 are natural sites and 1 is a mixed site which makes India a home of World Heritage sites and if so, the details thereof;
- b) whether the Government is contemplating to make these heritage sites accessible to differently-abled persons which will further strengthen the country's rank in upcoming editions of the Travel Tourism Competitiveness Index (TTCI) and also establishing the country as a leading model of accessibility planning and implementation in the South Asian Region;
- c) if so, the details thereof along with the steps taken by the Government in this regard;
- d) whether the Government proposes to improve infrastructure in present museums and art galleries for differently-abled persons rather than building separate art galleries or sections at museums to meet the needs of such persons with disabilities; and
- e) the efforts made to develop inclusive cultural spaces, technologies and learning programmes to encourage the participation of differently-abled persons?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE (INDEPENDENT CHARGE) FOR CULTURE AND TOURISM (PRAHLAD SINGH PATEL)

- (a) Yes Sir, India has 38 UNESCO World Heritage Sites, out of which, 30 are cultural sites, 07 are natural and 01 is a mixed site. The list of world heritage sites is annexed at Annexure-I.
- (b) & (c)Yes Sir, arrangements have been made at most of the World Heritage Sites under Archaeological Survey of India to make these sites accessible to differently-abled persons by providing wheel chairs, ramps, Braile cultural notice boards, etc.

(d) & (e) Visit of differently abled persons is facilitated at museums and art-galleries by way of providing wheel chairs, ramps, signages and brochures in Braille. In addition, special section 'Anubhuti' with tactile/brail enabled narrative has been installed at National Museum, Delhi.
