SPENDING ON AGRICULTURAL RESEARCH

251. SHRI RAJENDRA AGRAWAL:

Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE AND FARMERS WELFARE कृषि और किसान कल्याण मंत्री be pleased to state:

- (a) the amount of money spent on funding agricultural research in terms of GDP contribution;
- (b) whether the Government plans to increase it further and if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefor;
- (c) the steps taken by the Government to improve the quality of agricultural research and infrastructure in the existing bodies; and
- (d) whether the Government is undertaking foreign collaborations with think tanks and research institutions to improve quality of agricultural research, and if so, the details thereof?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FARMERS WELFARE कृषि और किसान कल्याण मंत्री (SHRI NARENDRA SINGH TOMAR)

- (a) The amount of money spent on agricultural research and education in terms of percentage of Agriculture Gross Domestic Product (Agri-GDP) in India was 0.60% during 2017-18 at current prices.
- (b) The public budget for agricultural research and education increased from Rs 102.1 billion in 2014-15 to Rs. 111.21 billion in 2017-18.
- (c) The steps to improve the quality of agricultural research and infrastructures are taken up on the recommendations of the subject specific expert committees. The Expenditure Finance Committee (EFC)/ Standing Finance Committee (SFC) approves such recommendations for improving quality of agricultural research and infrastructure in existing bodies.
- (d) The Department of Agricultural Research & Education (DARE), Government of India has been collaborating with foreign research institutions/ universities in all the fields of agriculture to improve quality of research outputs. Presently, DARE/ICAR has 59 active MoUs for collaboration with foreign organizations including Universities, CGIAR institutions, FAO and other international institutions.
