3154. SHRI E.T.MOHAMMED BASHEER:

Will the Minister of MICRO, SMALL AND MEDIUM ENTERPRISES be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government proposes to launch Bharat Craft Porter for Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSME) sector;
- (b) if so, the details thereof and its aims and objectives; and
- (c) whether the Government proposes to introduce any rejuvenation package for MSME sector and if so, the details thereof?

ANSWER

(a)&(b): The Government of India has set up Government e Marketplace (GeM) Portal. On this Portal, there are 76,953 Micro and Small enterprises (MSEs) on-boarded and their order value is Rs.23347 Crore till 9th February, 2020.

Apart from above, MSME Global Mart Portal developed by National Small Industries Corporation, a PSU, under the Ministry of MSME, offers services including online registration, web store management, multiple payment options, customer support through Call Centres and enhanced security features.

(c): The Government of India has taken following special support measures for MSME sector:

- 1 Launch of 59-minute loan portal to enable easy access to credit for MSMEs. In-principle approval of loans up to Rs. 1 crore through the portal. Portal link through GST portal.
2. (i) 2% interest subvention for all GST registered MSMEs, on incremental credit.
(ii) Increase in interest rebate from 3% to 5% for exporters who receive loans in the pre-shipment and post-shipment period.
3. (i) Companies with turnover of more than Rs. 500 crore to be brought on the Trade Receivables e-Discounting System (TReDS) to enable entrepreneurs to access credit based on upcoming receivables.
(ii) All CPSUs to be onboarded on TReDS Platform.

4. Central Public Sector Undertaking (CPSUs) units to make mandatory procurement of 25% instead of 20% from MSEs.
5. CPSUs to make mandatory procurement of 3% from Women Entrepreneurs out of 25% mandatory procurement.
6. CPSUs to compulsorily be part of Public Procurement Portal GeM- Government e-Marketplace. CPSUs to get their vendors registered on GeM portal.
7. 20 Hubs and 100 Spokes in the form of Tool Rooms for Technological Upgradation to be established across the country with a fund allotment of Rs. 6000 crore.
8. Clusters for Pharma MSMEs to be formed and supported with 70% Govt. of India assistance.
9. Only one annual return to be filed for 8 Labour laws and 10 Union regulations to simplify Government procedures.
10. Computerized random allotment for visits to firms by Inspectors to simplify Government procedures.
11. Environment Clearance and Consent to establish unit, under air pollution and water pollution laws, to be merged into a single consent. Return to be accepted on the basis of Self-Certification.
12. Ordinance has been promulgated to enable entrepreneurs to correct the minor violations under the Companies Act through simple procedures rather than to approach Courts.
