**ASSISTANCE UNDER NDRF** 

3786. SHRI RAVNEET SINGH BITTU:

Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of the funds demanded and the funds disbursed to various States/UTs in the country under the National Disaster Response Fund (NDRF) during the last three years, year and State/UT-wise;
- (b) the details of the States/UTs which have not fully utilised these NDRF funds during the said period, year-wise;
- (c) whether the Government intends to develop any mechanism for proper and quick assessment and timely delivery of the NDRF funds to the States to ensure its correct utilisation and distribution; and
- (d) if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefor?

#### ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI NITYANAND RAI)

(a) & (b): Financial assistance is provided from National Disaster Response Fund (NDRF), as per laid down procedure. State-wise details of assistance sought and releases from NDRF during the year 2017-18 to 2019-20 (as on 29.02.2020) are given in Annexure.

As per the scheme of NDRF each State Government is responsible to ensure that the expenditure incurred out of the funds received under the NDRF is in accordance with the norms approved by the Central Government. The State Accountant General is required to monitor the expenditure as per the items and norms of assistance. The Comptroller and Auditor General of India conducts audit

of NDRF. All the States have reported full utilization of NDRF except partial utilization by the State Government of Andhra Pradesh (for cyclone 'titli' of 2018 & drought of 2018-19) and Kerala (for flood/ landslides of 2018-19).

(c) & (d): The Government of India has taken a significant decision on 19<sup>th</sup> August, 2019 that an Inter-Ministerial Central Team (IMCT) would be constituted immediately in the aftermath of any natural calamity of severe nature, even before receipt of Memorandum from the State, which would visit the affected areas of State so as to have the first hand assessment of the damages caused and relief work carried out by the State Administration. For timely delivery of NDRF, States have to ensure timely submission of detailed information/memorandum as per SDRF/NDRF guidelines, which are available on Ministry of Home Affairs' website: www.ndmindia.nic.in.
