- (a) India Post Payment Bank (IPPB) is a wholly owned government scheduled payments bank offering a range of products such as savings and current accounts, remittances and money transfer, direct benefit transfers, bill and utility payments, enterprise & merchant payments including Government to Citizen (G to C) payment and Aadhar Enabled Payment System (AePS). These products, and related services, are being offered across multiple channels (Counter Services, Micro-ATM, Mobile Banking App, SMS and IVR, and at the doorstep).
- (b) A list indicating number of post offices in which IPPB services are being provided State/UT-wise is at **Annexure-I**.
