CANCELLED FLIGHTS

- (a) the total number of flights cancelled/diverted due to severe cold prevailed in northern part of India particularly in Delhi;
- (b) whether any passengers were given any compensation for cancellation of flights and late departures and arrivals; and
- (c) if so, the details thereof?

(a) As per information provided by airport operators viz Airports Authority of India(AAI) and Delhi International Airport Ltd.(DIAL) , a total of 284 flights were diverted due to bad weather/ poor visibility in the Northern Region of India from 15 Nov 2019 to 15 Feb 2020.

Region wise data for cancellation of flights is not maintained by airport operators or Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA). However, as per monthly traffic data received in DGCA from scheduled domestic airlines, a total of 144 flights were cancelled due to bad weather at Delhi from 30th November, 2019 to 9th March, 2020.

(b) & (c) As per the monthly submission of traffic data received from the scheduled domestic airlines, the compensation details for the month of November 2019, December 2019 and January 2020 for cancellations and delay of flights includes the following:

Month	Due to cancellation	Due to flight delays
Nov 2019	Rs. 50.73 lakhs	Rs. 199.97 lakhs
Dec 2019	Rs. 103.68 lakhs	Rs. 288.94 lakhs
Jan 2020	Rs. 46.73 lakhs	Rs. 180.01 lakhs.
