Prasar Bharati is also providing sign language news bulletins free of cost to the private satellite news channels in compliance with the "Accessibility Standards for persons with disabilities in Television Programming" issued by the Ministry of Information & Broadcasting on 11.09.2019. These guidelines also provide for implementation of closed captioning and/or sign language interpretation and subtitling in a phased manner.
