- (a) whether the production in textile sector has witnessed a large scale decline, if so, the details of textile production and export from the country during each of the last three years and the current year, State/UT-wise and product-wise;
- (b) whether the Government has any plan for boosting the production and exports in the country, if so, the details of the export of textile products and the revenue earned therefrom during the said period, country and product-wise;
- (c) the total amount of FDI made in the textile sector during the said period;
- (d) the details of measures taken by the Government to boost textile sector in the country during each of the last three years and the current year, State/UT-wise; and
- (e) the details of funds and incentives made available to textile industries during the said period, State/UTwise along with the details of employment likely to be generated through textile sector?

(a) & (b): There has been no major decline in the production of total spun yarn during the period from 2017-18 to 2019-2020 as per the data given below. However, as per the provisional data, for the period from April to July 2020-21 the production of total spun yarn has reduced by 15% when compared to the corresponding period of 2019-20. Estimated production of man made fibre, filament yarn and spun yarn for last three years and current year is given below:

The details of product-wise export of handloom products, export of major textile items and country wise Export of textile items are at **Annexure-I, Annexure-II and Annexure-III respectively.**

Further, Government, has conducted a Symposium with textile Export Promotion Councils and other industry stakeholders for finalizing a list of potential export products against which exports of textile and apparel can be enhanced. The list of potential export products were shared with the Indian Mission abroad for identification of potential buyers in the respective countries. In order to make the textile sector competitive by rebating all taxes/levies in international market, the Government has decided to continue the RoSCTL (Rebate of State and Central Taxes and Levies) scheme until such time the RoSCTL scheme is merged with Remission of Duties and Taxes on Exported Products (RoDTEP) scheme. For this purpose, the Government has approved adhoc allocation of funds of Rs. 7398 crore for FY 2020-21 for issuance of duty credit scrips under RoSCTL scheme. Further, in order to boost exports in MMF sector, Government has removed anti-dumping duty on PTA (Purified Terephthalic Acid), a key raw material for the manufacture of MMF fibre and yarn.

(d) & (e): With a view to boost textiles sector in the country, government has initiated two important steps which were part of Budget Announcement in Lok Sabha on 01.02.2020. These are;

- Creation of National Technical Textiles Mission with total outlay of Rs 1480 crore. Technical textiles are textiles which are used for their functional properties, rather than for aesthetics or comfort. There are a large varieties of technical textiles some of which are used in important applications such as agriculture, health and hygiene, medical applications, soil and water conservation, roads and highway, railways, airports, sea-ports, defence, protection of personnel in military, para-military, petrochemical/chemical industries, safety of fireman etc. The aim of the Mission is to position India as a major producer, consumer and exporter of technical textile products in the world map, therefore boosting its economy and technological capability.
- Abolition of anti-dumping duty on *Purified Terephthalic Acid* (PTA), which is a critical input for man-made textile fibre and yarns. Its easy availability and competitive pricing is desirable to unlock the immense potential in textile sector which is a significant employment generator.

In order to promote and develop various sectors/ segments of the textiles and clothing industry, the Government has been implementing various policy initiatives and schemes which inter alia support/improve the lives and livelihoods of textile weavers through employment generation and promotes production and export competitiveness of the textile industry such as Amended Technology Upgradation Fund Scheme (A-TUFS), Schemes for the development of the Powerloom Sector(Power-Tex), Schemes for Technical Textiles, Scheme for Integrated Textile Parks (SITP), Scheme for Additional Grant for Apparel Manufacturing Units under SITP (SAGAM), Jute (ICARE- Improved Cultivation and Advanced Retting Exercise), Integrated Processing Development Scheme (IPDS), National Handloom Development Programme, Comprehensive Handloom Cluster Development Scheme (CHCDS), Silk Samagra, Integrated Wool Development Programme (IWDP), North East Region Textiles Promotion Scheme (NERTPS), Rebate of State and Central Taxes and Levies (ROSCTL) etc.

Budgetary allocation of funds is not made State-wise. The funds are allocated Scheme-wise on pan India. However, indicative physical targets are allotted to States/implementing agencies and funds are released based on viable proposals received and utilization of previous funds. The details of funds allocation/expenditure in major textile sector is at **ANNEXURE-V**.

The government is implementing the Samarth-Scheme for Capacity Building in Textiles Sector, a placement oriented programme targeting skill development of 10 lakh youth in the entire value chain of textiles, excluding Spinning & Weaving in the organized Sector. Some of the advanced features of SAMARTH scheme include Training of Trainers (ToT), Aadhar Enabled Biometric Attendance System (AEBAS), CCTV recording of training programme, dedicated call centre with helpline number, mobile app based Management Information System (MIS) and on-line monitoring of the training process. The Government had approved the Samarth Scheme with a total outlay of Rs. 1300 crore.

Under Samarth, 18 State Governments have been allocated a training target of 3.6 lakh beneficiaries for conducting training programme in traditional and organized sectors. The States have entered into MoU with Ministry on 14.08.2019. Sectoral Organizations of Ministry (DC-Handlooms, DC-Handicrafts, Central Silk Board & National Jute Board have been allocated a training target of 43,000 beneficiaries for skilling/up-skilling in traditional sectors.

Further, Ministry initiated the process of empanelling industry/industry associations for undertaking industry oriented entry-level skilling programmes in the organized sectors. A total of 76 industries have been empanelled under Entry-level skilling and allocated a training target of 1.36 lakh beneficiaries. Also, 44 industries for upskilling programme have been empanelled and allocated training target of 30,000 beneficiaries.

With a view to improve the participation of MSME in the skilling programme, a separate RFP was floated to empanel industry associations working with MSME sector textile industries. Physical verification of training centres proposed 11 industry associations applied under this category has been commenced.

Also handloom workers are provided training for up-gradation of their skills. During the last three years and the current year, 23,739 handloom workers have been provided training to upgrade their skill, 33,043 Looms /Accessories provided under HSS and 103574 number of loans have been sanctioned to handloom weavers under the MUDRA Scheme.
