GROWTH OF RURAL WAGES

307. SHRI SISIR KUMAR ADHIKARI:

Will the Minister of RURAL DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has made any report on growth in rural wages, month-wise on the inflation rate (BASE rate 2010) and adequate demand for a four members family in the country;
- (b) if so, the details thereof;
- (c) whether the Government is of the opinion that the current per head rural income is not adequate to maintain a rural household;
- (d) if so, the reasons therefor along with the details of programmes to overcome post covid-19 crisis thereto; and
- (e) the measures being taken or proposed to be taken by the Government to increase the per head rural income?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF RURAL DEVELOPMENT (SHRI NARENDRA SINGH TOMAR)

(a) to (c): As per the information shared by Ministry of Labour& Employment, Labour Bureau compiles and maintains Consumer Price Index Numbers for Agricultural and Rural Labourers (Base 1986-87=100) (CPI-AL & RL) and average daily wage rate data in respect of selected agricultural and non-agricultural occupations based on the data collected by the Field Operation Division (FOD) of National Sample Survey Office (NSSO). Month-wise average daily wage rate in respect of Non-Agriculture Occupation along with CPL-RL with effect from January 2010 onwards is at Annexure-I.

As per section 6(1) of Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (Mahatma Gandhi NREGA), 2005, the Ministry of Rural Development notifies Mahatma Gandhi NREGA wage rates every year for States/UTs based on Consumer Price Index for Agricultural Labour (CPI-AL) published by Labour Bureau, Shimla, to compensate MGNREGA workers against inflation. The wage rates are made applicable from 1st April of each Financial Year. State/UT-wise wage rate under Mahatma Gandhi NREGA during the financial year 2014-15 to 2019-20are given at **Annexure-II**.

Initiatives taken by the Government in response to COVID-19

1. Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Yojana	On 26.03.2020, Government has announced Rs.1.70 Lakh Crore relief package under Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Yojana for the poor to help them fight the battle against Corona Virus. One of the components of said package was to provide ex-gratia of Rs.1000 in two 2nstalments (Rs.500/- each) to the existing old age, widow and disabled/Divyangjan beneficiaries of the schemes of National Social Assistance Programme (NSAP). The NSAP Division timely released a total of Rs. 2814.50 crore as ex-gratia to States/Uts in April, 2020 as first tranche and in May, 2020 as second tranche under Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Yojana (PMGKY) for the existing 282 lakh beneficiaries of NSAP schemes.
2. AatmaNirbhar Bharat Abhiyan	Prime Minister Modi, in his fifth address to India since the national lockdown, has announced a financial package of Rs.20 lakh crore to ease the coronavirus distress. The package is announced under 'AatmaNirbhar Bharat Abhiyan' to revive the Indian economy.
a. Stepping up Budget of MGNREGA by Rs. 40,000 crore	Government has made an increase in allocation for MGNREGS by Rs. 40,000 crores to overcome Covid-19 crisis provisioning income through wage employment. A total of 184 crore person days have been generated so far in the current FY 2020-21
b. Hike in wage rate under MGNREGA	Hike in wages for manual workers under Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarentee Act (MGNREGA) for Rs.182 to Rs. 202/day in FY20-21
3. Garib Kalyan RojgarAbhiyaan (GKRA)	Further, Garib Kalyan RojgarAbhiyaan (GKRA), launched by the Hon'ble Prime Minister on 20.06.2020 across six selected states across 116 districts to provide livelihood opportunities to rural citizens with a provision of Rs. 50000 Cr. An expenditure of Rs. 23,767.32 crore has been incurred in these districts till 13.09.2020
4. Pradhan Mantri Jan Dhan Yojana PMJDY	An amount of Rs. 30944.61 Crores has been credited as ex-gratia payment to 20.61 cr. Women PMJDY beneficiary account in three equal 2nstalments of Rs.500/-
