- (a) whether the State of Punjab has sought central assistance in terms of Viability Gap Funding (VGF) for its biomass projects;
- (b) if so, the details thereof;
- (c) whether the Government has taken any steps to meet this demand of the State of Punjab which can help tackle the stubble burning problem in the State;
- (d) if so, the details thereof; and
- (e) if not, the reasons therefor?

- (a) & (b) The Ministry had received representations from the State Govt. of Punjab requesting for grant of Viability Gap Funding (VGF) assistance @ Rs 5 Crore/MW to rice straw based biomass power projects of capacity 150 MW in Punjab for utilization of excess paddy straw that is burnt in the fields.
- (c) to (e) Considering these representations and to discuss the issue of rice straw burning in northern states of India, a Stakeholder consultation with the representatives of State Governments of Haryana, Punjab, Uttar Pradesh, Rajasthan, SECI, IREDA and various Biomass developers was held in January 2020 at MNRE.
