(a) There are 10 (ten) number of Oil Depot Shut down during last three years (April, 2018- March, 2021). The details of the same is as under:

(b) & (c) There is no proposal to reopen Depots which are already closed. Some of the Depots have been relocated, the detail is annexed. IOCL and HPCL Depots at Hanumangarh were non-OISD (Oil Industry Safety Directorate) compliant and closed during 2010-11.

In consideration of limited volumes in the district of Hanumangarh and Sri Ganganagar, development of New Depot at Hanumangarh was not commercially viable. The markets of Hanumangarh & Sri Ganganagar are being fed from the Pipeline fed State of the Art Terminals at Jaipur & Jodhpur.

9	Najibabad Depot (HPCL)	After commissioning of Rewari Kanpur Pipeline loading from Meerut/ Mathura was found to be economical for the outlets of Najibabad Depot. After augmentation of Meerut Depot in 2020-21, Najibabad based outlets were attached to Meerut Depot. Najibabad Depot was closed during 2020-21.		
10	Vadodara Depot (HPCL)	Old Vadodara Depot was, closed during 2020-21, as new Vadodara Terminal was constructed with pipeline connectivity from Palanpur on Mundra- Delhi Pipeline, which is more economical.
