- (a) the special trains that are being operated after lockdown, zonewise;
- (b) whether any regular trains are also being operated during this period;
- (c) whether the special trains charge higher fares than the regular train fares; and
- (d) the total revenue generated by increasing the fares in these special trains?

STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO PARTS (a) TO (d) OF STARRED QUESTION NO. 413 BY SHRI M.K. RAGHAVAN AND SHRI SANGAM LAL GUPTA TO BE ANSWERED IN LOK SABHA ON 24.03.2021 REGARDING OPERATION OF SPECIAL TRAINS.

(a) and (b) To prevent the spread of COVID-19 pandemic, Indian Railways discontinued all regular passenger carrying trains w.e.f. 23rd March, 2020 and is presently operating only Special Trains keeping in view the suggestions and concerns of State Governments. The zone-wise details of average daily number of trains being operated presently (as on 19.03.2021) is tabulated below:

(c) In view of health advisory due to COVID-19, regular train services are running as COVID specials on the fare as applicable for regular time Tabled trains. During COVID times as passenger demands are not uniform over different sectors, some special trains on special charges have been introduced to meet the additional demands over different sectors as per already published fare for special trains on special charges as applicable. Further, unreserved second class has been declared as reserved second class in view of pandemic situation.

In view of COVID-19 protocol, fare in short distance trains also varies depending upon categorization of trains as either COVID special second class unreserved express or train on demand/festival special or passenger special.

(d) The total passenger revenue between the period April, 2020 to February, 2021 is ₹ 12,409.49 crores as against ₹ 48,809.40 crores for the corresponding period of previous year.
