'Marine Poaching'

Will the Minister of FISHERIES, ANIMAL HUSBANDRY & DAIRYING be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government is aware that there is an increase in the number of cases of poaching of marine in the country;
- (b) if so give details of the cases of poaching of marine reported during the last three years, Yearwise and State-wise;
- (c) whether the Government has made any stringent provisions to check the said incidences in the country, if so, the details thereof; and
- (d) whether the Government has an estimate of the loss incurred due to marine poaching in the country during the last three years; if so, the details thereof?

ANSWER

(a) & (b) As per the information received from the Indian Coast Guard (ICG), there is no trend in increase of poaching by foreign fishing vessels in Indian waters observed. Indian Coast Guard is maintaining surveillance in Exclusive Economic Zone of India for enforcing provisions of the Maritime Zones of India (Regulation of Fishing by Foreign Vessels) Act, 1981. Details of cases of poachers apprehended during the last three years as furnished by the Indian Coast Guard is given below:
