MISSING CHILDREN

†1979. SHRI JYOTIRMAY SINGH MAHATO:

Will the Minister of WOMEN AND CHILD DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Central Government has received any data from the Government of West Bengal regarding missing women and children and if so, the details thereof;
- (b) total number of missing women and children reported from West Bengal, district-wise;
- (c) whether any negligence in the recovery of these children on part of State Government has been observed; and
- (d) if so, the remedial steps being taken by the Government in this regard?

ANSWER

MINISTER WOMEN AND CHILD DEVELOPMENT (SMT. SMRITI ZUBIN IRANI)

(a) to (d): As per the information provided by National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB), districtwise data of the total no of missing women & children reported from West Bengal during the year 2017 to 2019 is **Annexed**.

The Ministry of Women and Child Development hosts a web portal "TrackChild" to track the missing and found children. The TrackChild Portal is implemented in association with various stakeholders including Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA), Ministry of Railways, State Governments/UT Administrations, Child Welfare Committees, Juvenile Justice Boards, National Legal Services Authority, etc. "Khoya-Paya" is a citizen centric portal for reporting sighted children. The Ministry also supports 24x7 outreach helpline service for children in distress under 'Child Protection Services' scheme, which is available through a dedicated toll free number, 1098 accessible from any where in India. The National Commission for Women and National Commission for Protection of Child Rights have issued notices to the State in respect of such complaints.

The Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act, 2015 (JJ Act) mandates safety net of service delivery structures along with Institutional and non- Institutional care for children in need of care and protection and children in conflict with law. Section 2 (14) (vii) defines missing children as children in need of care and protection. The Ministry implements a centrally sponsored Child Protection Services (CPS) Scheme for supporting the children in distress conditions. Under CPS, financial assistance is provided to States/UTs, for, inter-alia, undertaking a situational analysis of children in difficult circumstances and for setting up and maintenances of Child Care Institutes (CCIs) for providing rehabilitative services. The primary responsibility of execution of the Act rests with the States/UTs.
