COVID-19 VACCINES OPERATIONAL GUIDELINES

1984.SHRI S. JAGATHRAKSHAKAN:

Will the Minister of **HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:

- (a)whether the Government has so far prepared a 113-page COVID-19 vaccines operational guidelines, which was shared with State/UTs on December 15;
- (b) whether the same has not yet been released in the public domain, if so, the details thereof and the reasons therefor;
- (c) whether the Government has identified the category of persons who are likely to get vaccinated, if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefor; and
- (d) whether the Government has prepared a database on people with co-morbidities, if so, the details thereof and if not, the manner in which the Government is likely to identify such persons for vaccination?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (SHRI ASHWINI KUMAR CHOUBEY)

- (a) & (b): Yes, operational guidelines for COVID-19 have been shared with all States/UTs on 11th December 2020 and after receiving comments from States the operational guideline was updated and shared with all States/UTs on 28th December 2020. The Operational guidelines is also available in the public domain through website of Ministry of Health & family Welfare, Government of India.
- (c): The National Expert Group on Vaccine Administration for COVID-19 (NEGVAC) provides guidance on all aspects of COVID-19 vaccination including prioritization of population groups for COVID vaccination.

NEGVAC has prioritized Health Care Workers and Front-Line Workers during the initial phase of COVID-19 vaccination followed by prioritized population groups of persons aged 50 years and above, and those aged less than 50 years with comorbidities.

(d): NEGVAC has a system in place to finalize the co-morbidities for prioritization for COVID-19 vaccination.
