### **Retention Rate**

#### 2126. SHRI JAYANT SINHA:

Will the Minister of EDUCATION be pleased to state:

- (a) the retention rate for students in Government schools across the country at the elementary level, State-wise, gender-wise;
- (b) the retention rate for students in Government schools across the country at the middle school level, State-wise, gender-wise;
- (c) the retention rate for students in Government schools across the country at the high school level, State-wise, gender-wise;
- (d) the retention rate for students in Government schools across the country at the senior secondary level, State-wise, gender-wise; and
- (e) the steps taken/ proposed to be taken by the Government to ensure greater retention in schools?

## ANSWER

#### MINISTER OF EDUCATION (SHRI RAMESH POKHRIYAL 'NISHANK')

- (a) to (d): The retention rate for 2018-19 of primary, upper primary, secondary and higher secondary level State wise and gender wise is at Annexure.
- (e) : Improving retention rate of students in school is a continuous process. Government of India launched Samagra Shiksha - an Integrated Scheme for school education, w.e.f. 2018-19, as an overarching programme for the school education sector extending from pre-school to class XII and aims to ensure inclusive and equitable quality education at all levels of school education.

Further, in order to improve the education standard, the Government has taken several steps:-

- 1. Central RTE Rules have been amended on 20th February, 2017 to include reference on class-wise, subject-wise Learning Outcomes at Elementary level.
- 2. National Achievement Survey (NAS) is conducted to enable States/UTs to identify gaps in learning outcomes.

- 3. A 70 indicator based matrix Performance Grading Index (PGI) has been developed to grade the States/UTs.
- 4. NISHTHA (National Initiative for School Heads and Teachers Holistic Advancement), an Integrated Teacher Training Programme has been introduced.
