ACCELERATING THE PACE OF VACCINATION

2792. KUMARI SHOBHA KARANDLAJE:

Will the Minister of **HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has allocated Rs.35000 crore for COVID-19 vaccination in the Budget 2021-22;
- (b) whether the Government has reviewed the status and progress of COVID vaccination, if so, the details thereof as on date, State/UT-wise;
- (c) whether the Government has identified the issues that need attention of the States/UTs to improve and accelerate the coverage, if so, the details thereof;
- (d) the steps taken by the Government to exponentially increase the pace of vaccination;
- (e) the names of the States/UTs that have achieved 60 percent or more vaccination coverage of healthcare workers; and
- (f) the time by which Co-WIN 2.0 version will be released?

**ANSWER
THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND
FAMILY WELFARE
(SHRI ASHWINI KUMAR CHOUBEY)**

- (a): The Union Budget 2021-22 provides for Rs 35,000 crore for COVID-19 vaccination.
- (b): Yes, the Government of India regularly reviews the progress of COVID-19 vaccination across the States/UTs. The State/UT-wise details of vaccination are at Annexure-1.
- (c) & (d): The Government of India is monitoring the daily vaccination coverage in States/UTs based on which advisories are issued to States & UTs for improving the coverage. The current rate of COVID-19 vaccination is satisfactory and is being further increased through increase in number of COVID-19 Vaccination Centres (CVCs) in both Government and Private health facilities.
- (e): As on 8th March 2021, a total of 32 States/UTs have achieved 60% or more coverage of Health Care Workers. The names of the States/UTs are at Annexure-2.
- (f): Co-WIN 2.0 has been released on 1st March 2021.
