Will the Minister of ENVIRONMENT, FOREST AND CLIMATE CHANGE be pleased to state:

- (a) the total number of anti-poaching camps (APC) available in various wildlife protection sanctuaries along with the number of foot soldiers employed in various camps in the country;
- (b) whether such camps are having proper infrastructure and weapons for the safety of its employees;
- (c) if so, the details thereof;
- (d) whether the employees in anti poaching camps are permanent employees or are employed on contract basis; and
- (e) if so, the details thereof along with the steps taken by the Government to absorb contractual employees in permanent cadre like other Government employees?

## MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF ENVIRONMENT, FOREST AND CLIMATE CHANGE (SHRI BABUL SUPRIYO)

- (a) As per the information received from the States/UTs, the details of total number of Anti-Poaching Camps (APC) along with the number of foot soldiers employed in the camps is at **Annexure.**
- (b) and (c) As per information received from the States/UTs, the infrastructure available in these camps varies from temporary to permanent structures. In some States/Union Territories, anti-poaching camps are also provided with weapons.
- (d) and (e) As per the information received from the States/UTs, both permanent and contractual employees are engaged by the State/UTs in anti-poaching camps.Rules/policies regarding appointment to permanent cadre vary from State to State.
