MEDICAL COLLEGES THROUGH PPP MODE

2972. SHRI UDAY PRATAP SINGH:

Will the Minister of **HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has launched any scheme to encourage the setting up of medical colleges through PPP mode in the country, if so, the details thereof, State/UT-wise particularly in Madhya Pradesh;
- (b) the total number of new medical colleges sanctioned and being run at present, State/UT-wise;
- (c) whether the Government has received any proposals for setting up of medical college in Hoshangabad - Narsinghpur - Raisen of Madhya Pradesh and if so, the details thereof, district-wise;
- (d) if not, whether the Government proposes to establish Medical colleges in these districts; and
- (e) the details of the funds allocated and utilized for setting up new medical colleges and hospitals in Madhya Pradesh during the last five years and the current year?

ANSWER

**THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND

(SHRI ASHWINI KUMAR CHOUBEY)**

(a): The Department of Economic Affairs (DEA) vide its notification dated 20.07.2020 has allowed Viability Gap Funding to Medical Colleges for setting up in PPP mode by utilizing the existing District Hospitals subject to the condition that: -

- i. States fully allow the facilities of the hospital to the medical college;
- ii. States provide land to the medical college at a concession.

The Scheme provides the following:

Sub Scheme – 1: VGF support for CAPEX upto 60% of the TPC will be provided to Health & Education sectors. The projects eligible under this category should have 100% Operational cost recovery. The Central Government will provide VGF support for CAPEX upto maximum 30% of the TPC of the project and State Government / Sponsoring Central Ministry/ Statutory Entity may provide further VGF support upto maximum 30% of the TPC.

Sub-Scheme 2: It will be limited to support demonstration pilot projects in the Health and Education sectors only. The projects eligible under this category should have at least 50% Operational Cost recovery. The Central Government will provide VGF support for CAPEX upto maximum 40% of the TPC of the project and State Government Sponsoring Central Ministry/ Statutory Entity may provide further VGF support upto maximum 40% of the TPC. In addition, the Central Government and State Government / Sponsoring Central Ministry /Statutory Entity can provide upto 50% (25% + 25% each) of Operational & Maintenance costs for the first five years after Commercial Operation date.

(b): Under Centrally Sponsored Scheme for establishment of New Medical colleges attached with existing district/referral hospitals, 157 new medical colleges have been sanctioned by the Government in three phases. The details of medical colleges approved under the scheme is at **Annexure**. Out of these 157 approved medical colleges, 47 medical colleges have become functional. These are at:-

1. Port Blair in A&N Islands
2. Naharlagun in Arunachal Pradesh
3. Diphu in Assam,
4. Rajnandgaon & Ambikapur [Sarguja] in Chhattisgarh
5. Nahan [Sirmaur], Chamba and Hamirpur in Himachal Pradesh
6. Dumka, Hazaribagh, Palamu (Daltonganj) in Jharkhand
7. Anantnag, Baramulla, Rajouri, Doda and Kathua in Jammu & Kashmir
8. Datia, Khandwa, Ratlam, Shahdol, Vidisha, Chhindwara and Shivpuri in Madhya Pradesh
9. Gondia and Nandurbar in Maharashtra
10. Falkawn in Mizoram
11. Baripada (Mayurbhanj), Koraput, Bolangir and Balasore in Odisha
12. Barmer, Bharatpur, Bhilwara, Churu, Sikar, Dungarpur and Pali in Rajasthan
13. Basti, Faizabad, Firozabad, Shahjahanpur and Bahraich in Uttar Pradesh
14. Birbhum (Rampur Hat), Purulia, Cooch behar, Diamond Harbour and Raiganj (North Dinajpur) in West Bengal.

(c) & (d): The Government has not received any proposals for setting up of medical colleges in Hoshangabad – Narsinghpur - Raisen districts of Madhya Pradesh. Further, under Phase – III of the scheme, all 75 approved medical colleges have already been allotted.

(e): Under CSS for establishment of new medical colleges funds are allocated for setting up of new medical colleges. The details of funds allocated in setting up of medical colleges in Madhya Pradesh during last five years is as under:-
