3581. SHRI PINAKI MISRA:

Will the Minister of EXTERNAL AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) the number of Indian migrant workers who registered to work in the Gulf countries;
- (b) whether the Government has reduced the minimum referral wages for employment in the Gulf countries and if so, the details thereof;
- (c) whether the Government will consider revising this reduction given the general economic distress caused due to Covid-19 and if so, the details thereof; and
- (d) the number of labour complaints received by embassies in Gulf countries in the last three years?

ANSWER THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS [SHRI V. MURALEEDHARAN]

(a) The number of Indian migrant workers who registered on eMigrate to work in the Gulf countries during last five years is follows:-

(b) & (c) The revised Minimum Referral Wage (MRW) in Bahrain, Oman, UAE and Qatar has been fixed at USD 200. MRW in Saudi Arabia has been fixed at USD 324 and MRW in Kuwait has been fixed at USD 245 for work visa holders and USD 196 for Domestic Sector Workers.

At present, there is no proposal for further revision of the MRW, which was reviewed recently, *inter-alia*, in view of economic conditions, due to Covid-19.

(d) The number of labour complaints received by embassies in Gulf countries in the last three years is as follows:-
