- (a) the main objectives of the Integrated Scheme for Development of Silk Industry;
- (b) whether the scheme has promoted the production of silk and if so, the details thereof;
- (c) whether the tribal families are getting the benefits of the said scheme; and
- (d) if so, the details of the beneficiaries of these schemes during the last three years?

- (a): The Govt. of India through Central Silk Board has been implementing a Central Sector Scheme "Silk Samagra" an Integrated Scheme for Development of Silk Industry (ISDSI) during the years 2017-18 to 2020-21 for the overall development of silk industry in the Country with an aim & objective to scale up production by improving the quality and productivity and to empower downtrodden, poor & backward families through various activities of sericulture in the country.
- **(b):** Yes. The raw silk production in the country has shown increasing trend during last five years due to implementation of the "Silk Samagra" scheme and other initiatives of Government. The details of total raw silk production in the country during last 5 years (2015-16 to 2019-20) are given below:
