The scheme-wise allocation and utilization of funds under the various schemes of the Ministry of Rural Development during the last three years in the State of Tamil Nadu are given below:

i. Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme (Mahatma Gandhi NREGS)

Mahatma Gandhi NREGS being a demand driven programme, no State/UT-wise (including of Tamil Nadu) financial allocation is made. The details of fund released by Central Government to the State of Tamil Nadu and expenditure incurred (including State share) under Mahatma Gandhi NREGS during the last three years are as under:
