- (a) whether the Government has identified the by sector as one of the champion sectors, with a long term vision and plan to develop toy clusters in the country;
- (b) if so, the details thereof;
- (c) whether the Government plans to give a boost to domestic toy manufacturers; and
- (d) if so, the details thereof?

ANSWER

- (a) & (b): Yes Sir. The toy sector has been identified as one of the champion sectors. A number of measures have been identified to develop toy clusters in the country with a long term vision. Some of the measures identified are: Using toys as a learning resource; Designing of toys based on Indian values, culture, and history; Organizing hackathons and grand challenges for toy designing and manufacturing; Public procurement of indigenous toys; Promoting Made in India toys; Promoting indigenous toy clusters; Monitoring quality of toys; Controlling imports of sub-standard and unsafe toys, etc.
- (c) & (d): A number of toy clusters have been identified for boosting domestic toy manufacturers. The details of the toy clusters are enclosed at Annexure.

B) Ministry of Textiles has identified 13 clusters across the country with a view for the overall development of cluster artisans. These clusters are located at Channapatna, Kinhal, Kondapalli, Etikopaka, Nirmal, Tanjore, Cudappah, Varanasi Chitrakoot, Jaipur, Dhubri, Bishnupur and Indore. Virtual Toy fair was organized during 27th February 2021 to 4th March 2021 in which 1074 exhibitors participated, including 2I5 artisans from these 13 clusters. Need based intervention are being provided in these clusters such as Technology support, marketing, soft and hard interventions, infrastructural support for the sustainable development of handicraft artisans.
