CHILD MORTALITY RATE

854. MS. PRATIMA BHOUMIK:

Will the Minister of **HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government maintains data with regard to the new born/child mortality rate in the country if so, the details thereof during the last five years, State/ UT-wise;
- (b) the steps being taken by the Government to reduce new born or child mortality rate in the country;
- (c) whether the Government has taken any focus/ special steps to reduce the new born/child mortality rate in the country including North-Eastern States; and
- (d) if so, the details thereof, State/UT-wise including Tripura?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (SHRI ASHWINI KUMAR CHOUBEY)

(a): Sample Registration System (SRS) Statistical Report annually published by Registrar General of India contains the data regarding newborn and child mortality.

Newborn and child mortality at National level and Larger States/UTs covered under SRS for last 5 years (2014-18) are placed at Annexure 1 and 2.

(b) to (d): In order to bring down the mortality among newborn and children, the Government of India is supporting all States/UTs including North-Eastern States under National Health Mission in implementation of Reproductive, Maternal, Newborn, Child, Adolescent health and Nutrition (RMNCAH+N) strategies.

Special steps/ interventions related to reduction of newborn and child mortality include:

- Sick Newborn Care Units (SNCUs) established at District Hospital and Medical College level for care of sick and small babies.
- Newborn Stabilization Units (NBSUs) established at First Referral Units (FRUs)/Community Health Centres (CHC) for care of sick and small babies (Details of SNCUs and NBSUs are placed at Annexure 3).

• Under Home Based Newborn Care (HBNC) and Home-Based Care of Young Children (HBYC) program, home visits by ASHAs are undertaken to improve child rearing practices and to identify sick new-born and young children in the community.

Other interventions include the following:

- Early initiation and exclusive breastfeeding for first six months and appropriate Infant and Young Child Feeding (IYCF) practices are promoted under Mothers' Absolute Affection (MAA).
- Social Awareness and Actions to Neutralize Pneumonia Successfully (SAANS) initiative has been launched for reduction of Childhood morbidity and mortality due to Pneumonia.
- Universal Immunization Programme (UIP) is being supported to provide vaccination to children against life threatening diseases such as Tuberculosis, Diphtheria, Pertussis, Polio, Tetanus, Hepatitis B, Measles, Rubella, Pneumonia and Meningitis caused by Haemophilus Influenzae B. The Rotavirus vaccination has also been rolled out in the country for prevention of Rota-viral diarrhoea.
- Children from 0 to 18 years of age are screened for 30 health conditions (i.e. Diseases, Deficiencies, Defects and Developmental delay) under "Rashtriya Bal Swasthya Karyakaram" (RBSK) to improve child survival. District early intervention center (DEIC) at district health facility level are established for confirmation and management of children screened under RBSK.
- Nutrition Rehabilitation Centres (NRCs) have been set up at public health facilities to treat and manage the children with Severe Acute Malnutrition (SAM) admitted with medical complications.
- Intensified Diarrhoea Control Fortnight / Defeat Diarrhoea (D2) initiative has been launched for promoting ORS and Zinc use and for reducing diarrhoeal deaths.
- Anaemia Mukt Bharat (AMB) strategy as a part of Poshan Abhiyan aims to strengthen
 the existing mechanisms and foster newer strategies to tackle anaemia which include
 testing & treatment of anaemia in school going adolescents & pregnant women,
 addressing non nutritional causes of anaemia and a comprehensive communication
 strategy.
- Name based tracking of mothers and children till two years of age is done through RCH portal to ensure complete antenatal, intranatal, postnatal care and immunization as per schedule.
- Several capacity building programs of health care providers are undertaken for improving maternal and child survival and health outcomes.
