#### TRAINING OF YOUTH UNDER DDU-GKY

#### \*107. SHRIMATI BHAVANA PUNDALIKRAO GAWALI:

Will the Minister of RURAL DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Deen Dayal Upadhyay-Grameen Kaushal Yojana (DDU-GKY) is being implemented by the Government in the country and if so, the details thereof, Statewise including Maharashtra;
- (b) whether the youth in rural areas of Osmanabad and Yavatmal-Washim are being imparted training under the said scheme, if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefor;
- (c) the details regarding the number of youth who have been imparted training and those, out of them, who got employed after completion of training;
- (d) the method through which training is being imparted under DDU-GKY; and
- (e) whether any special education project has been formulated for the said youth and if so, the details thereof?

# ANSWER MINISTER OF RURAL DEVELOPMENT (SHRI GIRIRAJ SINGH)

(a) to (e): A Statement is laid on the table of the House.

### Statement referred to in reply to Parts (a) to (e) of LokSabha Starred Question No. 107 due for answer on 27.07.2021

(a) Yes, Sir. Ministry of Rural Development is implementing Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Grameen KaushalyaYojana (DDU-GKY), a placement linked skill development program for rural poor youth under National Rural Livelihoods Mission (NRLM) since September, 2014. Rural Youth in the age group of 15-35 years are covered under this scheme. DDU-GKY guidelines provide for earmarking 50% of the funds for SCs and STs and 15% for minorities. Further, one third beneficiaries of the respective categories including general category covered under the scheme should be women.

DDU-GKY follows a 3-tier implementation architecture for implementation. National level is responsible for policy, funding of central share and technical support, while State Rural Livelihood Missions (SRLMs)/ State Skills Missions are responsible for funding of State share, implementation and monitoring controls. Project Implementing Agencies (PIAs), which are mostly private training partners, are responsible for mobilization, training and placements.

DDU-GKY is being implemented by 871 PIAs having 2322 Training centres across the country. Under DDU-GKY, a total of 10.89 lakh candidates have been trained (since its inception (September, 2014) till June, 2021) while 7.04 Lakh candidates have been placed. The State-wise number of candidates trained and placed since 2014-15 till June, 2021is given at **Annexure**.

(b) Yes, DDU-GKY is being implemented in rural areas of districts of Osmanabad, Yavatmal and Washim. The number of candidates trained and placed since 2014-15 till June, 2021is given as under:

(d) & (e) Under DDU-GKY training is being imparted to the youth based on the qualification packs, approved by National Skills Qualification Committee of the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship. The training consists of theory, practical and on-job training imparted in domain skills. Additionally computer skills, english skills and life skills, are also imparted to make the trainees adapt better to the work environment.
