(a)to(c) Yes, Sir. Ministry of Culture is developing new science/ cultural museums in the country.

National Council of Science Museums (NCSM), an autonomous organization under the Ministry of Culture, Govt. of India, has developed a chain of Science Cities/ Science Centres/ Innovation Hubs throughout the Country through Scheme for Promotion of Culture of Science (SPoCS). Details of setting up of new Science Cities/Science Centres under SPoCS Scheme alongwith estimated amount of funds to be spent and the time by which these Science Cities/Science Centres are likely to be opened, is annexed at **Annexure- `I'**.

Cultural Museums are developed through various organizations under administrative control of Ministry of Culture. List of new cultural museums being set up in the country alongwith estimated amount of funds to be spent and the time by which these Cultural Museums are likely to be opened is annexed at **Annexure-'II**'.
