**Will the Minister of SKILL DEVELOPMENT AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP
be pleased to state:**

- (a) the number of people including those from the tribal community likely to be skilled by the Government in the next five years;
- (b) the details of the amount of the budget allocated for the said purpose; State-wise;
- (c) the number of Skill Development Centres along with the details of average capacity of each centre in the country especially in tribal areas;
- (d) the number of such centres likely to be opened during the above said period;
- (e) whether the Government proposes to develop these Skill Development Centres with the collaboration with public, private and in a public-private partnership; and
- (f) if so, the details thereof; and
- (g) the details of other benefits being given to candidates belonging from tribal community through these Skill Development Centres?

(a) As per the National Policy for Skill Development and Entrepreneurship, 2015 India has a target to train 402.87 million by 2022. This includes 104.62 million new entrants to existing workforce in the country who need to be skilled to meet industry requirement. In addition 298.25 million of existing workforce need to be reskilled/upskilled.

(b) The Ministry has been implementing Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana (PMKVY), Jan Shikshan Sansthan (JSS) Scheme and National Apprenticeship Promotion Scheme (NAPS) for providing short term Skill Development training to the youth belonging to all section of the society including tribal community. All of the above Schemes has the mandatory provision of utilization of funds for tribals through Tribal Sub Plan (TSP) component. The details of fund allocation under Tribal Sub Plan in the PMKVY Scheme, JSS scheme and NAPS in FY 2021-22 are given below:

(c) The MSDE through National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC) promotes establishment of model and aspirational skill centres known as Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Kendra (PMKK) for imparting skill training in every district throughout the country including the tribal areas. The list of PMKKs in tribal majority districts with more than 50% Schedule Tribes (STs) population with their annual capacity is placed at **Annexure**. In addition, the Ministry, under the JSS Scheme, 238 Jan Shikshan Sansthan are being functional and 75 new JSSs has been sanctioned for the current Financial Year (2021-22). In addition to this, under PMKVY Scheme, Training Centres (TCs) have been set up through NSDC. As on 10.07.2021, 2050 TCs have been operational under PMKVY 2.0. Further, there are 14,604 Industrial Training Institutes which provides long term training to all sections of the society including STs, out of which 1508 are in tribal areas. Capacity of a training centre/ institutes in terms of candidates varies from scheme to scheme and State to State.
