Eligibility for NET

1116. DR. ARVIND KUMAR SHARMA:

Will the Minister of EDUCATION be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has prescribed minimum percentage of marks in post graduate degrees to appear in National Eligibility Test (NET) as a benchmark for competence of students for being a lecturer;
- (b) if so, the details thereof;
- (c) whether the Government has taken note that this limit of minimum percentage has deprived many students to appear in NET;
- (d) if so, the details thereof and the reaction of the Government thereto?

ANSWER MINISTER OF EDUCATION (SHRI DHARMENDRA PRADHAN)

(a) to (d): Under the provisions of the University Grants Commission (UGC) Act, 1956, the UGC is mandated to take all steps for the promotion and co-ordination of University education and for determination and maintenance of standards of teaching, examination and research in Universities.

The UGC has informed that General/Unreserved/General-EWS candidates who have secured at least 55% marks (without rounding off) in Master's degree or equivalent examination from universities/institutions recognized by UGC in Humanities and Social Science (including languages), Computer Science and Applications, Electronic Science etc. are eligible to appear in UGC-NET. Relaxation of 5% is allowed for candidates belonging to Other Backward Classes (Non-Creamy Layer), Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Persons with Disability and Third gender.
