SECOND INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT AT JEWAR

- (a) whether the Government has finalized the land deal for second international airport at Jewar in Uttar Pradesh;
- (b) if so, the details of the bidder and the expected date of completion as per their bidding;
- (c) whether the main bidder has given sub-contract or any other authority to implement the project and if so, the details thereof;
- (d) whether any Special Purpose Vehicle is being engaged to carry out the project and if so, the details thereof;
- (e) the estimated cost and the number of passengers expected to utilise the new airport in its completion; and
- (f) whether it will have any impact on the existing international airport in Delhi and if so, the details thereof?

(a) : The State Government of Uttar Pradesh (GoUP) has informed that the task of acquisition of 1334 hectare of land for Phase-I of the project has been completed and the possession of the land has been obtained.

(b) to (e): GoUP has awarded the project to M/s Zurich Airports International AG for development of the airport. M/s Zurich Airport International AG has formed a Special Purpose Vehicle (SPV) -Yamuna International Airport Private Limited (YIAPL). The Concession Agreement has been signed on 7th October, 2020 between YIAPL and Noida International Airport Limited (NIAL), a State Government Company.

As per the master plan submitted by YIAPL, the forecast for initial year traffic is 4 Million Passengers Per Annum (MPPA) for the airport against the initial capacity of 12 MPPA for Phase I. The approx. project cost of Rs. 8914 Crore for Phase-I is inclusive of land acquisition cost with Probable Date of Completion (PDC) in 2023-24. However, timeline for completion of the airport projects depend upon many factors such as land acquisition, availability of mandatory clearances, financial closure, etc.

(f): The IGI Airport, Delhi is an operational airport. Government of India has granted 'in principle' approval for setting up of a new greenfield international airport at Jewar, Noida as a second airport to serve the need of Delhi National Capital Region. IGI Airport, Delhi will continue to remain operational.
