CIVIL AVIATION PROJECTS

Will the Minister of CIVIL AVIATION नागर विमानन मंत्री

be pleased to state:-

- (a) the current status of various ongoing civil aviation projects in the country including in Karnataka along with the allocations made and the amount spent so far, project-wise;
- (b) whether the Government proposes to set up more airports in the country and if so, the details thereof; and
- (c) the action plan prepared by the Government for the development of new domestic/international airports; and
- (d) the details of airports identified for development under UDAN scheme in Karnataka?

ANSWER

(a) to (c): Upgradation and modernization of civil aviation infrastructure is an ongoing process and is undertaken by concerned airport operators from time to time depending on the availability of land, commercial viability, socio-economic considerations, traffic demand / willingness of airlines to operate to/from such airports. In the State of Karnataka, three Greenfield Projects viz. Bijapur, Hassan, Shimoga with the estimated project cost of Rs. 150 Crore, Rs. 592 Crore and Rs. 220 Crore respectively have been given In-Principle approval by the Government of India. These projects are at various stages of planning/development. Bangalore International Airport Limited (BIAL) is undertaking expansion plans at an estimated project cost of Rs. 13,352 Crore. The responsibility of implementation of the project including funding of the project rests with the concerned airport developer and the respective State Government (in case the State Government is project proponent).

Ministry of Civil Aviation has launched Regional Connectivity Scheme (RCS) - UDAN (Ude Desh ka Aam Nagrik) on 21-10-2016 to stimulate regional air

connectivity. An airport which is included in the awarded routes of RCS - UDAN and requires upgradation/development for commencement of RCS operations, is developed under "Revival of unserved and underserved airports" scheme. Under the scheme, as on 20.07.2021, 59 airports including 2 water aerodromes and 5 heliports have been revived/operationalized, State-wise details are at Annexure.

Government of India (GoI) has also accorded 'in-principle' approval for setting up of 21 Greenfield Airports across the country namely Mopa in Goa, Navi Mumbai, Sindhudurg and Shirdi in Maharashtra, Bijapur, Hassan, Kalaburagi and Shimoga in Karnataka, Dabra (Gwalior) in Madhya Pradesh, Kushinagar and Jewar (Noida) in Uttar Pradesh, Dholera and Hirasar in Gujarat, Karaikal in Puducherry, Dagadarthi, Bhogapuram and Orvakal (Kurnool) in Andhra Pradesh, Durgapur in West Bengal, Pakyong in Sikkim, Kannur in Kerala and Hollongi (Itanagar) in Arunachal Pradesh. So far, Six Greenfield airports namely, Shirdi in Maharashtra, Durgapur in West Bengal, Pakyong in Sikkim, Kannur in Kerala, Orvakal (Kurnool) in Andhra Pradesh and Kalaburagi in Karnataka have been operationalized.

(d) Six airports, namely, Bidar, Mysore, Kalaburagi, Hubli, Vidyanagar and Belgaum have been operationalized under RCS-UDAN. Six airports namely Bellary, Karwar, Vijayapura, Kushalnagar, Kolar and Shimoga comes under the list of unserved/underserved airports as per UDAN scheme document. Routes connecting Vijayapura, Karwar, Shimoga have been included in the special round of UDAN 4.1.
