## **1929. DR. T.R. PAARIVENDHAR:**

## Will the Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE be pleased to state:

- (a) The total quantum of COVID-19 vaccines supplied/allocated to Tamil Nadu State as on date, Vaccines-wise;
- (b) Whether the Government of Tamil Nadu has requested the Union Government to supply additional/adequate vaccines from Central pool to meet the high demand for vaccination; and
- (c) If so, the details thereof and the action taken by the Government in this regard?

## ANSWER THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (DR. BHARATI PRAVIN PAWAR)

(a) to (c): As of 26<sup>th</sup> July 2021, a total of 2,15,71,920 doses of COVID-19 vaccines have been supplied to Tamil Nadu State, which comprises 1,83,78,470 doses of Covishield and 31,93,450 doses of Covaxin.

Various State/UTs including state of Tamil Nadu from time to time request the Union Government for additional supply of vaccine doses.

COVID-19 vaccine doses are procured centrally by Government of India and are supplied free of cost to States/UTs based on pro-rata target population, the progress of vaccination and vaccine wastage.

Advance visibility of these vaccine allocations i.e. the total doses of vaccine that would be available to a State/UT, are provided to States/UTs 15 days in advance so as to enable States/UTs to prepare plan for acceleration of vaccination coverage while being cognizant of the available vaccines.

In addition 25% of the production of vaccine manufacturers is available for direct procurement by private hospitals
